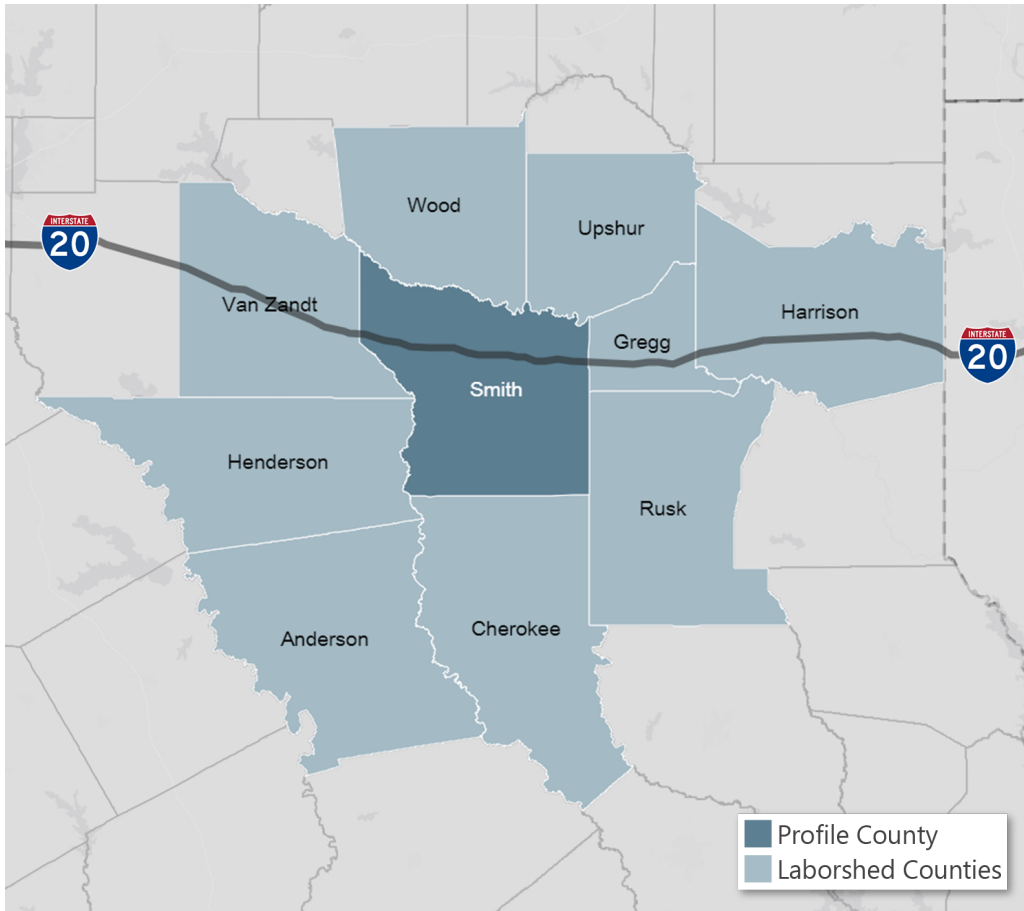

POPULATION 16+ YEARS

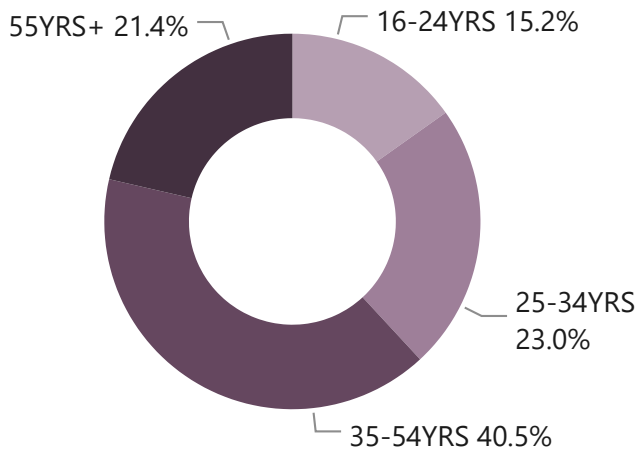


POPULATION 25-64 YEARS

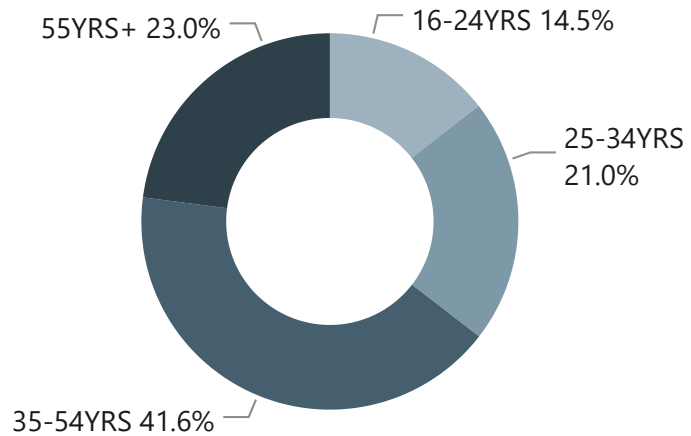


**AGE DISTRIBUTION OF PEOPLE PARTICIPATING IN LABOR FORCE, POPULATION AGE 16+ YEARS**

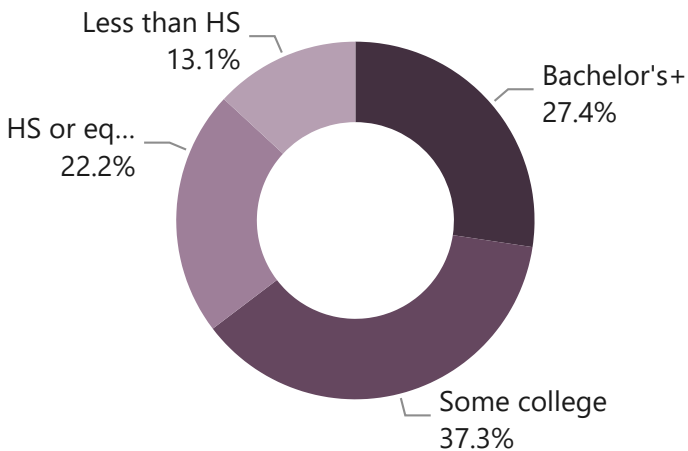

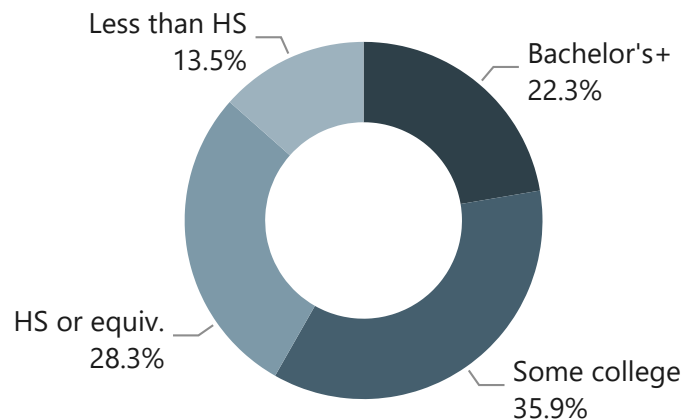

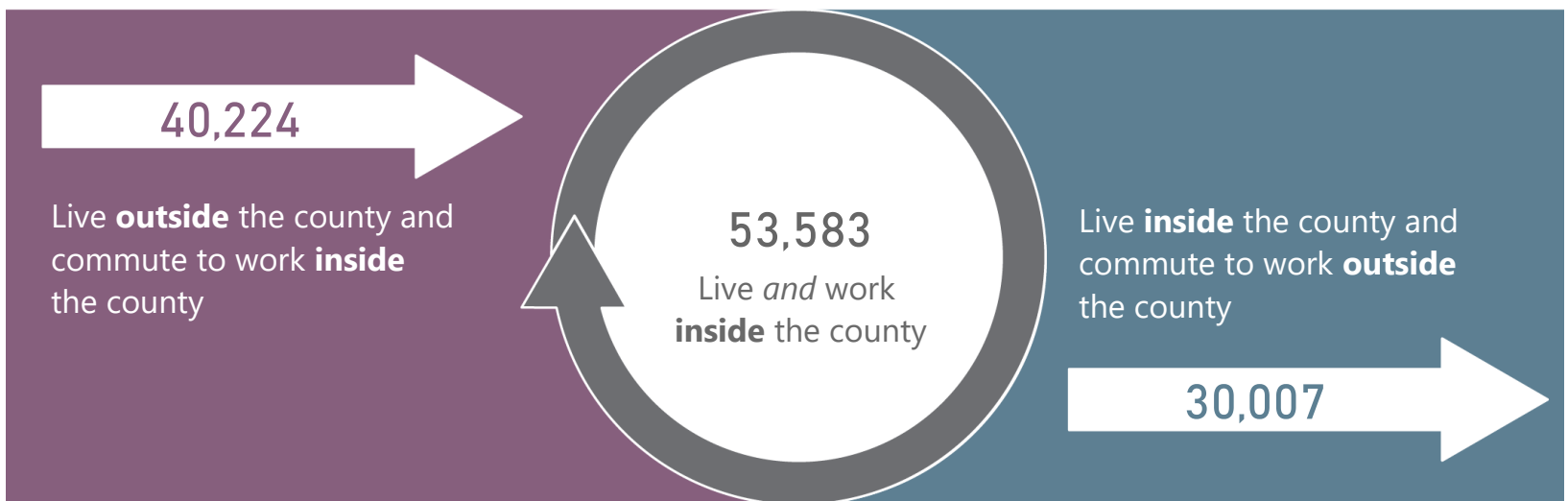
